

## ASSOCIATE OF ARTS (OREGON TRANSFER) DEGREE

(Rev. 03/14/08)

The AAOT degree is an agreement between the Oregon University system (OUS) and Oregon's community colleges to provide transfer of community college coursework to a state four-year institution (Oregon State University, University of Oregon, Eastern Oregon University, Portland State University, Southern Oregon University, Western Oregon University and Oregon Institute of Technology). Completing this degree can lead to junior standing upon transfer but does not guarantee automatic admission by the college or university. The AAOT is recognized by the colleges and universities as meeting institutional lower-division general education requirements but not necessarily school, department or major requirements with regard to courses or GPA. LBCC students are encouraged to consult with an advisor at the school they plan to attend.

Although **foreign language** is not required for an AAOT degree at LBCC, the OUS schools require two years of high school foreign language (same language) or two terms of college foreign language for all degrees. Furthermore, students planning to pursue a BA degree will be required to complete two years of foreign language study.
