

## **OREGON TRANSFER MODULE**

Any student awarded an Oregon Transfer Module (OTM) will have met the requirements for the OTM at any Oregon community college or institution in the Oregon University System. Upon transfer, the receiving institution may specify additional coursework that is required for a major, for degree requirements, or to make up the difference between the Transfer Module and the institution's total General Education requirements.

### **General Education Requirements**

All courses must be completed with a grade of "C" or higher. Students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 at the time the module is awarded.
